

Disclosure Statement**“The Impact of Women’s Health Clinic Closures on Preventive Care”**

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My funding support for this study is from the Princeton University Fellowship, and Princeton’s Department of Economics, the Center for Health and Wellbeing, and the Griswald Center for Economic Studies.

The analysis in this paper used nonpublic data from three sources: individual-level survey data from the Texas Department of State Health Services, individual-level survey data from the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, and clinic-level data from a national network of women’s health and family planning clinics whose name we cannot disclose as part of our data agreement.

No individuals were identifiable from the survey data (nor from the clinic-level data), and therefore this study does not require approval from an Institutional Review Board.

The national network of clinics, per our data agreement with them, reviewed our findings prior to their release to ensure that we did not inadvertently disclose any confidential information.

We are also working within the confines of our data agreement to provide a final data set that can be made publicly available and used for replication.
