The recipient of the 2024 AEA Distinguished Service Award is Rachel T.A. Croson, University of Minnesota, for her significant contributions to economics through her varied and numerous leadership roles. Among her contributions toward advancing the status of women in the economics profession, is her pivotal role as one of the principal investigators on the National Science Foundation grant that led to the creation of CeMENT workshops for junior women faculty in economics. Dr. Croson has also served as a mentor to countless female economists.

The annual AEA Distinguished Service Award recognizes volunteer efforts of individuals who have served the economics profession in a significant way. While this award is conferred by the American Economic Association (AEA), it is not expected that service be limited to AEA supported activities. The award winner is recognized at the AEA Awards Ceremony at the ASSA Annual Meeting.
