One of the most prestigious and eagerly anticipated AEA awards, the John Bates Clark Medal is awarded annually each April (formerly biennially from 1947–2009) to an American economist under the age of forty who is judged to have made the most significant contribution to economic thought and knowledge.

Distinguished Fellows

The **Distinguished Fellow** award recognizes the lifetime research contributions of outstanding economists. Since 1965, past presidents of the AEA are recognized as Distinguished Fellows, and up to four additional individuals may be elected for the award in one calendar year.
